THE MISSION



Following the principle of mutuality, the Group is constantly seeking effective ways to give back part of the value generated to the territories where it has its roots.

With this vision in mind, on 24 October 2017, Reale Foundation was established, an international corporate foundation spanning all Group companies and operating in Italy, Spain, Chile and Greece. Through **community engagement** activities, it adopts a structured and systemic sustainability strategy to manage donations to initiatives of collective interest in a targeted manner.

Its mission is to contribute to the achievement of the **Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations 2030 Agenda**, signed in 2015 by 193 UN member countries, with the aim of promoting sustainable, inclusive and lasting economic growth.

With this in mind, the Foundation responds to the expectations of stakeholders and the needs of the areas in which the Group operates, promoting interventions aimed at enhancing the territory and the well-being of the communities in question. Activities are carried out with an approach focused on **strategic direction, coordination and rigorous** verification of the destination of donations.

GOVERNANCE



The operations of Reale Foundation are overseen by the **Group's Sustainability Division** and carried out through the collaboration of three bodies: the Board of Trustees, the Sustainability Committee and the Operating Committee.

- **The Patron Committee.** Responsible for the preliminary assessment and approval of the Foundation's annual programme, the Board of Trustees is composed of the following Group companies:

- **The Sustainability Committee.** This body, composed of directors from various Group companies, is responsible for ensuring that the Foundation's activities are in line with the ethical principles and sustainability objectives that guide the Group's actions.
- **The Operating Committee.** Within the Operating Committee, representatives of the Group companies play an advisory role, examining individual project proposals and evaluating the annual programme before it is presented to the Patron Committee.

Reale Foundation develops projects in Italy, Spain, Chile and Greece thanks to contributions from Group companies, determined annually by their respective Boards of Directors and set within a maximum overall limit of **1% of the Group's consolidated net profit**.

HEALTH & WELFARE

Reale Foundation is committed to supporting a sector with growing needs and critical issues, in line with the Group's values and experience. For this reason, the Foundation promotes initiatives in the field of **prevention** and **health** with the aim of:

- **combating the onset of chronic diseases** by addressing risk factors linked to widespread conditions such as cardiovascular and respiratory diseases, diabetes and cancer;
- **improve the well-being of patients**, suffering from these disorders, facilitating access to care and support for the most vulnerable people, with a positive impact on their physical, psychological and social quality of life.



FUNDACIÓN DFA – SPAIN
**DESPERTANDO SUS SENTIDOS,
DESPERTANDO SUS SONRISAS**



Fundación DFA promotes the inclusion of people with disabilities, employees and those at risk of exclusion. It promotes programmes to prevent marginalisation and improve social, occupational, cultural, educational and health development and mobility, with a focus on women, young people and the elderly.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

The **Foundation's Child Development Centre** is dedicated to supporting children with developmental disorders and their families, offering comprehensive and personalised assistance. Thanks to a multidisciplinary team, which works in synergy to develop tailor-made programmes using innovative techniques, the centre aims to promote growth in all its dimensions. The goal is not only to improve the well-being of children, but also to lighten the burden on families by offering spaces designed for sensory and psychomotor stimulation in a welcoming and inclusive environment. The project is being carried out in Zaragoza, in the Torrero-La Paz-Parque Venecia area.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

The project is aimed at children with disabilities and developmental disorders, offering support to their families as well. It focuses on the treatment of neurological disorders, autism, speech disorders, Down syndrome, genetic alterations, psychomotor difficulties, developmental delays, and emotional and behavioural disorders. As part of the project, **five rooms dedicated to cognitive, motor, and sensory development** will be equipped, where health and education specialists will be able to conduct individual or family therapy sessions.



FUNDACIÓ MON CLINIC – SPAIN
SALUD MENTAL INFANTIL Y JUVENIL



The Fundació Mon Clinic Barcelona, a non-profit organisation based at the Hospital Clínic de Barcelona, combines care, research and teaching to achieve excellence, with the aim of discovering the causes of diseases and improving patients' quality of life.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

The project aims to **improve mental health care** for children and adolescents admitted to the Hospital Clínic in Barcelona for acute treatment. With the inauguration of **two immersive virtual reality rooms**, the aim is to support the de-escalation of agitation crises and offer an innovative therapeutic tool in a group setting. The rooms, equipped with advanced technology, integrate visual and auditory projections, creating a safe and stimulating environment for patients.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

The project is aimed at children and adolescents admitted to the inpatient ward of Hospital Clínic in Barcelona. Beneficiaries will be able to use immersive technology to improve their mental health, helping to reduce agitation crises and promote emotional well-being during their hospital stay.



INCLUSION & SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

In line with the needs of this area of intervention, Reale Foundation supports the inclusion and social and economic development of young people through initiatives aimed at:

- **promoting youth inclusion**, enhancing knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviours to strengthen their financial literacy;
- **facilitate employability and integration**, helping young people to overcome disadvantage and develop key skills for entering the world of work.



ASD GIUCO '97 – ITALY
#NODIFFERENCE



ASD Giuco '97 has been operating for more than 25 years in Turin's Aurora district, providing poverty support services to around 15,000 people every year. The aim of the project is to offer the neighbourhood and the city a place that acts as a bastion of legality and a space for listening.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

The project involves the redevelopment and regulatory compliance of an existing structure, transforming it into a **space dedicated to welcoming and supporting marginalised people, with a particular focus on people** with disabilities.

The intervention includes the creation of new areas, including an **audio room** and a space dedicated to training and **events**, as well as the purchase of IT equipment to support the activities.

Thanks to this initiative, ASD GiuCo '97 will be able to involve users in **work placement, social inclusion** and **training programmes**, as well as organising **conferences** and **meetings**.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

With this new space, GiuCo '97 plans to involve at least 1,000 children over the age of 6 in inclusive sports activities and around 25 young people with disabilities between the ages of 16 and 30 in work placement programmes each year. The centre will also be an important training hub, thanks to activities dedicated to sports and social welfare operators.

The families of users will also benefit indirectly from the project, reaching an additional 15,000 people.



INTERSOS HELLAS AMKE - GREECE PROTECTION FOR ALL MINORS



Greece has long faced the arrival of unaccompanied minors, who are vulnerable to exploitation and abuse. The InterSOS Hella Akme project provides tailored assistance, counselling and legal support, helping them to rebuild their lives on a solid and secure basis.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

There is an urgent need for a **protection programme for unaccompanied minors**: emergency facilities are at capacity and the risk of exploitation and abuse is high. By offering support in synergy with government mechanisms, the project provides essential **information, advice** and **legal support** to the minors involved, enabling them to build a more peaceful future through the **provision of basic needs, local partnerships** and **capacity building**.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

In 2023, the programme recorded 766 cases, actively supporting **485 unaccompanied minors** between the ages of 13 and 17. In 2024, InterSOS reached **500 young people**, offering 500 social services sessions, 400 legal sessions, 3,000 contact attempts and 80 placements in official accommodation for unaccompanied minors. This commitment will continue to provide essential support for minors in difficulty in the coming years, responding to their daily needs.



ENVIRONMENT & SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES

Reale Foundation supports projects aimed at combating climate change, with a particular focus on:

- **enhancing resilience to natural disasters**, providing support to affected communities to deal with emergency and post-emergency phases.
- **reducing the risk and vulnerability**, of populations exposed to events such as earthquakes and floods.

This area of intervention also includes initiatives dedicated to the **artistic and cultural enhancement and development** of the territory, as well as the promotion of **sustainable mobility**, which are long-standing areas of focus for the Group.



CONSULTA PER LA VALORIZZAZIONE DEI BENI ARTISTICI DI TORINO - ITALY

ALLESTIMENTO DEL MOSAICO DI SAN SALVATORE



The project to display the medieval mosaic of San Salvatore aims to enhance the Diocesan Museum of Turin, revealing its hidden treasures. The goal is to offer a new, more engaging interpretation, enriching the narrative of the nearby archaeological area.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

In Turin, before the 15th-century cathedral was built, there were three medieval churches, including **San Salvatore**, whose presbytery, raised after the year 1000, had a mosaic in black and white tiles. Despite the demolition of the church in 1490, the work has survived to this day. The project involves its **restoration** and **display at the Diocesan Museum**, enriching the archaeological narrative with a multimedia exhibition. This intervention, in synergy with the new archaeological area of the Royal Museums, will enhance the museum and its cultural offering.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

The presence of the new mosaic, part of a new archaeological itinerary, combined with new multimedia elements, will give an innovative boost to the Diocesan Museum, allowing it to reach a **wider target audience** who will be able to discover the value of what has been restored and exhibited.



SLOW FOOD - CHILE

CIBO DI TERRA E MARE, PATRIMONIO DEL NOSTRO POPOLO RAPA NUI

The project promotes agroecological agriculture and the gastronomic traditions of Rapa Nui, also known as Easter Island. It protects local biodiversity, which includes unique plant species and marine fauna such as turtles and tuna, promoting sustainable practices and healthy food.

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

The project aims to raise **awareness among farmers and families** about the importance of agroecological agriculture and local biodiversity, which are essential for environmental and food sustainability in Rapa Nui. Through training courses, field visits and digital tools, the project promotes the **transmission of ancestral knowledge** related to sustainable farming and fishing, protecting native plant varieties and marine resources. It promotes the use of environmentally friendly agricultural techniques, without chemical agents, contributing to food security and the recovery of gastronomic traditions. It also strengthens the **island's cultural identity**, creating new economic opportunities for local communities and raising awareness of the need to reduce dependence on food imports.

WHO THE PROJECT IS AIMED AT

The project is aimed at a wide audience, with direct benefits for around **40 local producers** who will participate in agroecology workshops and practical training. In addition, the permanent exhibition at the Rapa Nui museum will be able to reach **between 80 and 250 visitors per day**, including tourists and residents. Awareness-raising initiatives, including radio "training capsules" and a travelling exhibition in Chile, will involve farmers, families and institutions, broadening the educational impact.



EMERGENCY PROTOCOL

Through its Emergency Protocol, the Reale Foundation intervenes promptly to support communities affected by natural disasters and unforeseeable events, providing the resources necessary to meet basic needs and promote recovery, to support rescue operations and the supply of essential goods, and to support reconstruction and redevelopment projects in the area.

In a context of increasing climate and environmental vulnerability, the Emergency Protocol is a fundamental pillar of the Foundation's mission, ensuring immediate support to affected individuals and communities and helping to generate a lasting impact.



VALENCIAN COMMUNITY
SPAIN: DANA EMERGENCY



On 29 October 2024, Spain was hit by violent torrential rains. In the Valencian Community alone, 77 municipalities were affected, with widespread damage to infrastructure, homes and businesses, over 240,000 claims for compensation and hundreds of thousands of people left without water and electricity.

Through its Emergency Protocol, the Reale Foundation allocated **€ 60,000** to respond to the **most urgent needs of the population**, support **housing reconstruction** and offer psychological support to the most vulnerable people. Additional resources were used to strengthen the local community and contribute to the environmental restoration of the **Albufera Natural Park**, with clean-up and ecosystem monitoring activities.



EMILIA-ROMAGNA

ITALY: EMILIA-ROMAGNA FLOOD



The flood of May 2023 hit Emilia-Romagna hard, submerging entire areas and leaving deep wounds in local communities. In Solarolo, water flooded the ground floor of the G. Ungaretti secondary school, significantly damaging classrooms, facilities, changing rooms and the entire gym, a central space for students' educational and sporting life.

In response to this damage, the Reale Foundation activated its Emergency Protocol, supporting the complete restoration and redevelopment of the gym, with structural and plant engineering work and the adaptation of spaces to make them safer and more accessible.

On 12 September 2024, in the presence of the authorities and General Figliuolo, Special Commissioner for Reconstruction, the school was returned to the community.

CONTEST OUR PEOPLE4PEOPLE

Through Reale Foundation, Reale Group strengthens the **sense of community** and **shared identity** of those who work in and for the Group. Every year, the **Contest Our People4People** offers **employees** of Group Companies the opportunity to nominate and support projects by non-profit organisations deserving of financial support.

In the latest edition, **34 projects** were proposed: 12 for Health & Welfare, 14 for Inclusion & Social Development, and 8 for Sustainable Environment & Community.

The **four projects** that received the most votes from the online community received **€ 10,000** each, for a total of €40,000 from the Foundation.



- **Corso di sci di Totta** di Associazione Sciare per Sorridere ODV ETS
The project involves school-age children and young people from economically, socially and culturally disadvantaged backgrounds in free snow activities, contributing to their education through sport.

- **La voce dell'afasia** di Musica e Cura APS
Musica e Cura offers a rehabilitation programme for people with aphasia and their families, based on music therapy and singing as tools for reactivating linguistic, motor and socialisation functions.

- **Borealis: un'Aurora immaginaria** di Kaninchen-Haus APS
The Aurora district of Turin is undergoing a process of transformation: with the opening of a new cultural and social space, Kaninchen-Haus is responding to this trend by offering spaces for socialising and exchange, study rooms, art galleries, markets and co-working spaces.

- **Micro sonda per piccoli cuori** di Associazione Amici dei Bambini Cardiopatici ODV ETS
The aim of the project is to donate a transoesophageal probe to the cardiac surgery operating theatre of the Regina Margherita Children's Hospital in Turin, so that patients weighing less than 2 kg can be treated safely and appropriately.



CONTEST TOGETHER 4 A BETTER WORLD

Through the first international edition of the Contest Together 4 a Better World, Reale Foundation was able to strengthen its **social commitment in Italy, Spain, Chile and Greece**, generating a positive impact in all countries where the Group is present and operates through the involvement of **Employees and Agents**.

Of the **74 projects in the competition**, 47 came from Italy, 17 from Spain, 6 from Chile and 4 from Greece.

The **10 projects** that received the most votes from the online community received **€ 10,000** each, for a total of € 100,000 donated by the Foundation.



- **Snakes' truck** di #RUNFOREMMA & friends ETS

Given the increase in the number of members of the Powerchair Football Snakes Milano team, the aim of the project is to purchase a van to transport all the competition wheelchairs without burdening families in terms of costs and logistics.

- **RunChallenge** di PlayMore!

RunChallenge builds more inclusive communities through running: by forming small groups that train together in public spaces in participating cities, it encourages people to overcome fears and prejudices, creating bonds between people, regardless of disability.

- **ABITO Project** di ODV Società di San Vincenzo de Paoli

The project promotes the social inclusion of children and young people in financial difficulty, offering them the opportunity to choose clothing free of charge, just like in a shop, thus giving them a taste of normality.

- **Fundación Olivares Care Unit** di Fundación Andrés Olivares

The project aims to assist the needs of children admitted to the Hospital Materno of Malaga and their families, ensuring access to specialised psychological, physiotherapy and speech therapy care both in hospital and at home.

- **Fly with AMA.LE** di Associazione Ama.le IQSEC2 APS

By creating an accessible route for people with disabilities within the Prali (TO) adventure park, the Association will be able to enrich the activities offered to people with disabilities during the three-day summer camp that takes place every year.

- **Choreography from the heart** di Con.Te.Sto Odv

Con.Te.Sto. aims to involve young people with autism spectrum disorder from Ruvo di Puglia, Bisceglie and Trani in three intensive days of choreography practice in suitably organised premises. Participants work first on an individual basis and then in small groups.

- **On a tray** di Asociación Provincial Síndrome de Down de Málaga

The project involves people with intellectual disabilities in a work integration programme in the hotel and catering sector. The training will cover the entire supply chain of the sector.

- **Inclusive Recreation** di Centre de Lleure El Dofí

In Alt Empordá, people with intellectual disabilities have few leisure opportunities and limited support from public services. The project was created to offer them accessible recreational spaces and activities, improving the quality of their free time.

- **Target 2025 Italia PCF Cup** di ASD Thunder RomaSD Thunder Roma

Thunder Roma's main objective is to enable the wheelchair football team to participate in the 2025 Italian Powerchair Football Cup by providing the resources to cover the costs.

- **San José Football Club** di Fraternidad Sacerdotal de los Misioneros de San Carlos Borromeo


The project offers young people in Puente Alto (Santiago, Chile) a safe educational space where they can grow and feel secure through sport and relationships with teachers, while also creating greater harmony in their often turbulent family environments.



THE DISBURSEMENT PROCESS

To ensure the protection of all the Foundation's stakeholders in accordance with defined ethical and behavioural principles, an assessment of the **internal control system** was conducted in 2018 with the aim of monitoring the risks associated with the Foundation's activities.

In this context, promoting a culture of **risk management** and implementing controls at organisational and individual level are essential tools for ensuring the effective and efficient use of the resources generated, guaranteeing the accuracy of the information disclosed and complying with current rules and regulations.



As part of the process of awarding grants to the projects submitted, the controls carried out include:

- analysis and validation by the Board of Trustees of the areas of intervention identified, the initiatives to be supported and the partners with whom to establish collaborations;
- verification by the Sustainability Committee of the consistency of the areas and projects with the Code of Ethics, the Statute and the programme guidelines, with any inconsistencies or anomalies reported to the Operational Committee so that it can adjust or rectify the choices made or provide useful information to support the proposals identified;
- the traceability of data provided by potential beneficiaries in grant applications, as well as supporting documentation, through a structured model that allows for objective verification of eligibility, project effectiveness, strategic and value alignment, and project sustainability, both in the short term and in the event of termination of support by the Foundation;
- the preparation of specific reports containing a list of projects for which a grant application has been submitted or a project to be supported has been identified;
- the analysis and validation by the Patronage of the projects included in the implementation plan, previously selected by the Operational Committee on the basis of the information contained in the reports;
- monitoring and evaluating projects by analysing the data reported in the progress file compiled by the beneficiary entities and the supporting documentation collected;
- reporting periodically to the Board on the progress of projects until their completion;
- verifying that the amounts to be disbursed correspond to those provided for in the payment authorisation.








Italy | 44 Initiatives



Chile | 3 Initiatives






Support for communities affected by emergencies: timely intervention in crisis situations is a priority, ensuring rapid and effective responses to emerging critical issues.






