Our Mission

Founded on 24 October 2017 as a cross-group corporate foundation and based on the experience of Fundación Reale in Spain, our mission is to develop international **community engagement** activities, adopting a structured and systemic sustainability strategy for managing donations to initiatives for the community.

In order to **return part of the value generated to the original area**, our main mission is to achieve the **Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations 2030 Agenda**, signed by 193 UN member countries that, since 2015, have been committed to creating the conditions for sustainable, inclusive and long-lasting growth.

To this end, we meet the expectations of all stakeholders and the needs of the areas in which the Group is present and operates, enhancing the relevant areas and acting in favour of the communities in Italy, Spain and Chile. Our approach is based on **directing, coordinating** and accurately **checking** the allocation of all donations.

Governance

The Foundation operates via the Group's Sustainability Department, assisted by a Patron Committee and an Operating Committee.

The **Sustainability Committee** - made up of directors representing all group companies - checks these activities. Its members check that the Foundation's activities are in line with the ethical principles and the sustainability goals that drive the Group's actions.

As required by the applicable regulations, the Implementation Plan and the Activity Report are submitted annually to the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport in Spain.





Areas of intervention

In order to support the communities in Italy, Spain and Chile, our projects are carried out using the resources provided by the group companies which are determined annually by each board of directors, up to a maximum total of **1% of the Group's consolidated net profit**.

The resources are used in projects covering the following three areas of intervention: **Health & Welfare, Inclusion & Social Development, Environment & Sustainable Communities**, in line with Sustainable Development Goals **1** (No poverty), **3** (Good health and well-being), **8** (Decent work and economic growth), **11** (Sustainable cities and communities) and **17** (Partnerships for the goals).





Health & Welfare



We support initiatives in the field of prevention and personal care, which aim to:


- combat the **onset of chronic diseases** by reducing the risk factors caused by frequent chronic diseases such as diabetes, cancer and cardio-vascular and respiratory diseases;
- improve the **well-being of patients** suffering from these diseases by facilitating access to treatment and managing vulnerabilities, with positive effects on their quality of life from a physical, psychological and social point of view.



Health & Welfare

Un sostegno concreto alla ricerca

As part of the “Un sostegno concreto alla ricerca” (concrete support for research) project, Mitocon aims to find the funds necessary to purchase a state-of-the-art oxygraph for the Department of Biomedical Sciences at the Padua University. This tool is essential in order to improve the diagnostic processes of mitochondrial diseases and develop new therapeutic approaches



Scope of the project

Mitochondrial medicine studies the functioning of the mitochondria - the main source of energy in cells - in order to identify the genes responsible for these diseases and how such dysfunctions can alter energy production. While genetic studies are considered routine tests in many centres, **bioenergetic studies** are much less widespread owing to costs and available equipment.

However, an accurate identification of bioenergetic changes is essential in order to study the processes underlying mitochondrial diseases. To this end, Mitocon's **crowdfunding** activities are focused, in particular, on finding the resources necessary to support the Padua University - a reference point in Italy for mitochondrial medicine - in purchasing the equipment necessary to **improve the diagnostic processes and develop new therapies**.

Who will benefit from the project?



The studies that will be carried out using the new oxygraph will benefit **all people suffering from mitochondrial diseases**, which are estimated to be **1 in 5,000 individuals**.

Furthermore, the oxygraph would enable doctors to research all those diseases in which **mitochondria play a more or less direct role**, including Parkinson's, Alzheimer's and ALS.

Health & Welfare

Un nuovo approccio alla cura del sarcoma osseo

The Stem Cell Transplantation and Cell Therapy Laboratory at the Regina Margherita Children's Hospital has been working for years to identify new therapeutic approaches for bone sarcoma, a rare tumour that is particularly aggressive in children and adolescents. One of them entails the use of mesenchymal stem cells as a new drug delivery system.



Scope of the project

As part of the FORMA Foundation project, the Transplant Centre laboratory of the Regina Margherita Children's Hospital will be able to test the use of **mesenchymal stem cells** as a new **chemotherapy drug delivery system**, capable of migrating towards inflammatory microenvironments and accumulating where the tumour is located without cytotoxic effects for patients.

A new delivery system based on these microvesicles, which can be easily stored and standardised, would offer a new therapeutic approach by **improving the quality of life in children and young adults**. Furthermore, it could be used as **adjuvant therapy** with other treatments, such as surgery and radiotherapy, or to treat pulmonary recurrences.

Who will benefit from the project?

Despite being rare tumours, sarcomas are **the most aggressive disease among children and adolescents**.

A new system based on chemotherapy-loaded biological microvesicles will be identified as a **new stable**, easily storable and standardised **biological pharmaceutical product** to treat **sarcoma patients**, benefiting all of them.




Inclusion & Social Development



We promote the development and socio-economic inclusion of young people by supporting initiatives that foster:

- the **inclusion of young people** by cultivating knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviour to improve their financial capabilities;
- **employability** and **integration**, supporting young people at a disadvantage in developing competences and skills useful for their introduction in the labour market.



Inclusion & Social Development

Un Comedor contra la exclusión

Since 2011, Association Manos de Ayuda Social has been fighting poverty in Madrid by offering complete, healthy and balanced meals to people subject to socio-economic exclusion and difficulties in order to resolve their situation by assisting them in finding a job.



Scope of the project

In its **Comedor Social**, Manos de Ayuda Social offers complete, healthy and balanced meals that can also be **taken at home**, so that families can preserve the intimacy of their homes and better manage their time and the help they receive according to their individual needs. Many of them have young children who are still studying and others who are looking for work: helping their families with this kind of support allows them to **continue their studies** and **seek professional opportunities**.

The Association also promotes the **inclusion** of the people who apply to the Association in the labour market, by providing all the means and resources available to facilitate their integration in the **labour market** and become progressively independent.

Who will benefit from the project?


In 2021, Manos de Ayuda Social assisted **292 people** and the number of direct beneficiaries grew daily, resulting in a long waiting list.

Therefore, in 2022, the goal was to support **350 people**, in order to help them out of poverty and exclusion.

Inclusion & Social Development

Sostegno del diritto allo studio

Since its foundation, the University of Gastronomic Sciences of Pollenzo (UNISG) has been committed to promoting the right to education, privileging merit to geographical origin, background and economic possibilities of students and developing inclusive educational offers, including through fundraising.



Scope of the project

The UNISG project offers deserving students the opportunity to complete their studies by **covering all enrolment costs** and providing post-university support in terms of **job placement**, by creating a network of former students who act as the main ambassadors of the values of Pollenzo and the training they have received.

All this is possible thanks to fundraising activities which bring together **organisations and companies** that agree on the importance of guaranteeing an educational future for many young people, including migrants and students from southern world countries.

Who will benefit from the project?

The fundraising project will target **students of the bachelor's or master's degree programmes offered by UNISG in Pollenzo**, accounting for 10% of the total number of students enrolled.

Since its establishment, thanks to the contributions of its supporters, UNISG Pollenzo has guaranteed the right to education to **more than 300 students from over 40 countries**.



Environment & Sustainable Communities



We support projects to combat climate change:

- increasing the **resilience of communities** in case of natural disasters, supporting emergency and post-emergency management;
- reducing **risk exposure and vulnerability** in case of earthquakes and floods.

We also support projects for **artistic and cultural development** and enhancement of the area and initiatives that promote **sustainable mobility**.




Environment & Sustainable Communities

Bee Zoom

Pollination is key to preserving plant species. The Zoom Foundation's project aims to respond to the emergency affecting pollinating insects by managing, preserving and connecting the habitats necessary for their survival.

These activities are also useful in developing the skills and abilities of people in difficulty as they promote their inclusion.



Scope of the project

Pollinating insects are one of the main environmental emergencies. Since agricultural areas do not provide suitable habitats for wild pollinators, today, crop yields depend on both the surrounding vegetation and the **support of bees managed by humans**.

However, to date, only a few studies cover the pollination of wild species. As part of this project, the Zoom Foundation provides **13,670 square metres** to **study the local community of pollinators** and the **botanical species** they need, monitoring the health of bees and promoting beekeeping as a habitat restoration activity as well as a social rehabilitation work.

Who will benefit from the project?


This project will benefit the personnel involved in the research – **four researchers, two graduate candidates, two beekeepers, two farmers and two breeders** –, in addition to **environmental research organisations** and **local universities** that will use bees for environmental biomonitoring purposes by studying their interactions, **agro-ecological companies** by restoring botanical species, **municipalities** – first and foremost that of Cumiana, where Zoom Park is located – and **local associations**, which will schedule educational activities and meetings for the community.

Environment & Sustainable Communities

EFIES Programme

Quality higher education is essential to access equally valuable academic and professional opportunities.

To this end, Formando Chile operates in the most disadvantaged areas of the country so that young people can access fair and inclusive education that provides them with the tools necessary to build a future.



Scope of the project

As part of the EFIES (Escuela de Formación para el Ingreso a la Educación Superior) programme, Formando Chile plans to increase the access of **students in the third and fourth year of Chilean secondary schools** to **university, technical training and vocational institutes**, freeing them from the vulnerable situations they experience every day.

By offering **maths classes, language courses and self-knowledge workshops**, Formando Chile provides young people with the necessary tools to develop the skills and abilities they need to become successful socially and professionally.

Who will benefit from the project?

The EFIES programme targets **1,200 students in the third and fourth year of Chilean secondary schools with a vulnerability index exceeding 70%**. The educational process of these students has been compromised by their context; however, there are high expectations of access to high school.

Indirectly, the programme also benefits the **families** of the students involved and the **community** as a whole.



International projects




Our international projects transversally involve Italy, Spain and Chile, creating relationships and extending successful projects across borders, in order to share goals and benefits among the communities and the areas in which we are present and have been operating since 2017.

International projects

Powercoders Madrid

Spain is currently becoming one of the main landing countries for migrants and asylum seekers, recording more than 96,000 applications between 2017 and 2019. Despite their high potential, these communities face a number of obstacles to enter the labour market. The Powercoders project aims to provide refugees with a genuine support by organising programming and web development classes.



Scope of the project

After the two Italian editions, the first held in Turin and the second in Milan, the **Powercoders programme** was also implemented in Madrid (Spain), offering a group of refugees and asylum seekers an **IT training course to develop coding skills**, which they can use in a second phase of integration into the labour market.

The course also enables them to strengthen their soft skills and contact companies in order to explore one-year **internship opportunities**, followed by the subsequent possibility of actually finding a **job**.

Who will benefit from the project?

Powercoders Madrid directly involves a group of **20 refugees and unemployed young people**. Of these, 90% find an internship and more than 60% are hired by a company after one year.



This project has a positive impact on the **families of the beneficiaries** and is a **challenge to prejudice and stereotypes** concerning migration and youth unemployment.

International projects

Cereal marino

Eelgrass is an aquatic plant belonging to the marine phanerogams family.

Formerly growing on land, it now grows entirely in water and its seeds are being studied by chef Ángel León's Restaurante Aponiente because of their high nutritional value and positive impact in terms of environmental and social sustainability.



Scope of the project

By **reclaiming 300 square metres of salt marsh in the bay of Cádiz**, Aponiente has managed to grow eelgrass in a controlled way since 2017, testing it for human consumption.

A cereal rich in proteins, amino acids, vitamins and minerals, the seed of the eelgrass is one of the most sustainable on the planet. Indeed, in order to grow, it does not require **fertilisers** or additive nutrients, it **reduces the carbon footprint** and generates **ecological, landscape** and **social wealth**.

The goal of chef Ángel León and his restaurant is to find more and more ingredients similar to eelgrass in order to make marine food a sustainable resource, a true **food of the future**.

Who will benefit from the project?

The Cereal Marino project conducted by Restaurante Aponiente produces **environmental and nutritional benefits** in the areas where the eelgrass is grown and for the food market, as well as socio-economic benefits. Indeed, it creates **employment for the community of Puerto de Santa María (Cádiz)** thanks to the perennial crops on the estuaries of Cádiz.



The vaccination Hub

A new phase of the health emergency

Since the early stages of the Covid-19 pandemic, we have been helping the population to prevent and cope with the virus.

After the **projects supporting hospitals and families** and **CV-19 Reale Hub**, the vaccination hub at Reale Group CRAL (the recreational club for workers), we collaborated with **Sermig** in order to set up a **new hub within the Arsenale della Pace** in Turin.


The results

In **88 days** - from 2 January to 31 March 2022 – thanks to the help of the doctors and nurses of **Affidea Group CDC** and the welcoming and coordinating activities provided by the **Group's volunteers and the Associations**, **74,789 doses of vaccines** were given which, in addition to the 144,518 doses administered at Reale Hub, made it possible to **vaccinate 20% of Turin's population**.

BTogether 4 Ucraina

In order to offer real help to the **population threatened by the war**, we supported children and their families escaping the war, whose survival and freedom were threatened.

After organising an emergency flight in collaboration with the **Regione Piemonte** and **Lavazza** to transfer children with cancer fleeing Ukraine, we decided to use our Emergency Protocol to collaborate with **Casa Oz, Casa Ugi, Sermig – Arsenale della Pace, Associazione Matrioska** and **Adisco Sezione Piemonte** and offer them a safe location to continue their treatment at the Regina Margherita Children's Hospital, in addition to assisting refugees in Moldova during the first weeks of the war.



Collection of basic necessities

In March, we collaborated with the Associazione Matrioska in order to help the **refugees in Chişinău** assisted by the Moldovan organisation **Viața fără leucemie**.

Thanks to the **collection of basic necessities** organised at Reale Mutua Historical Museum, **450 boxes** were packed full of baby and personal hygiene products, first aid kits, blankets and winter clothing, which were transported to the Moldovan capital in a van provided by **Tecnoservice**.

The concert

Thanks to music we supported young cancer **patients who are being treated at the Regina Margherita Children's Hospital** and hosted with their families at the Casa Oz, Casa Ugi and Sermig family homes.

The concert, which was held on 5 May 2022 at the **Conservatorio Giuseppe Verdi** of Turin and was organised in collaboration with **Erato Choir**, directed by **Dario Ribechi** and conducted by **Mario Acampa**, enabled us to **raise the funds necessary** to provide them with the most pleasant stay possible.

Spain

The war had a severe impact on the **child protection system**. More than 98,000 children in the care of institutions have been left without resources and are living in high-risk situations of violence and neglect, with little chance of being safely evacuated.

In this respect, an **emergency fund** was set up with **Aldeas Infantiles SOS** to provide shelter, food, hygiene products, preventing the separation of families during displacement, facilitating the reunification in a safe place and ensuring psychological support.


Thanks to this programme, so far **more than 8,000 children** have been assisted, providing care and health assistance and **evacuating entire families** in Poland and Romania.

Our People4People

Every year, we promote the **sense of community** and of belonging among the Group **employees** by giving them the opportunity to identify and submit projects from non-profit-making organisations eligible for monetary donations.

In its most recent edition, OurPeople4People saw the participation of **25 projects**, of which **13** in the **Health & Welfare** area, **10** in the **Inclusion & Social Development** area and **2** in the **Environment & Sustainable Communities** area.

Based on the **satisfaction expressed by the Community through the web**, the four winning projects identified received a €10,000 donation each, for a total of €40,000.

1 As part of a nationwide multicentre study, **Eu brain APS** plans to identify possible genetic and non-genetic factors responsible for asphyxia and post-asphyxial encephalopathy so that possible risk pregnancies can be identified as early as 37 weeks of screening.

2 The **Rubens APS ASD** project involves and rehabilitates young people and young adults through psychological support activities, animal-assisted interventions with horses and dogs, workshops for work training and first steps to autonomy, enhancing their skills and sense of responsibility.

3 **Associazione Matrioska** offered immediate assistance and help to Ukrainian children and mothers fleeing the war by offering them shelter with families in Pianezza (Turin) and facilitating their integration into school and work, for a more peaceful and secure future.



In order to celebrate **our fifth year of activity**, we decided to involve all the organisations that have enabled us to make a positive impact in Italy, Spain and Chile, making them the stars of the celebrations.

As part of the 5 for Good initiative, we rewarded **five worthy projects of non-profit-making organisations** operating in **Italy, Spain and Chile**.

Prevenção de pobreza y riesgo de exclusión social en familias con un hijo enfermo de cáncer

- 1 As part of this project, **ASION** plans to help families with a child with cancer in a situation of poverty or at risk of social exclusion being treated at Madrid hospitals by covering the additional expenses incurred because of the cancer, such as drugs or transport to the health centre.



Figli di uno sport minore

- 2 The Association **Magic Torino-UILDM** encourages young people and adults with severe disabilities to play wheelchair hockey, by finding suitable venues and means of transport, ensuring customised equipment and finding the resources necessary to support these activities.

Proyecto Elías

- 3 **Lola Busca Nueva Imagen's** project aims to promote the well-being of children suffering from rare diseases and their families, by practically helping them to prevent risk factors and providing them with orthopaedic equipment, training in life-saving manoeuvres and offering psychological support.

Scuola di lingua e integrazione delle mamme

- 4 As part of this project, the **Associazione Sudanese di Torino** supports the younger generations starting with their mothers, helping them to learn Italian and obtain a mid-school certificate so that they can experience real and complete social and professional integration.

Equipamiento para la Pompa Italia

- 5 The project aims to provide each member of the **eleventh fire brigade of Santiago de Chile ("Pompa Italia")** with comprehensive safety and communication equipment, which is essential for them to be able to professionally assist the communities for which they work every day

Network4People


We promote relationships with all the Group's stakeholders, including **Agents**, who are **deeply rooted in the area** in which they operate.

As part of Network4People, Reale Mutua e Italiana Assicurazioni Agents can submit worthy projects for eligible non-profit-making organisations.

In its fifth edition, **12 projects** were submitted, of which **7** pertaining to the **Health & Welfare** area and **5** to the **Inclusion & Social Development** area.

Based on the **satisfaction expressed by the Community through the web**, three winning projects were identified, in addition to a fourth one which was selected by the panel of assessors.

The winning projects received a €10,000 donation each, for a total of €40,000.



Hospice Cuneo

- 1** The **Adas Foundation** project will provide 10 hospice beds, recovering and converting a historic building into a long-term care facility to meet the needs identified by the Piedmont Region and the Ministry of Health for the Province of Cuneo.

I giovani: una risorsa contro la povertà

- 2** The project of **La Casa del Melograno** deals with situations of poverty and lack of education through volunteering, involving young people aged between 15 and 18 in activities to support families living in the Vanchiglia neighbourhood of Turin, who are financially helped by Caritas, and their younger members.

CresciAMO atleti

- 3** **ASD Passeportout** uses sports to help young people with disabilities living in the Valsesia area to develop self-esteem and interact with their peers, becoming aware of their own abilities through training, training courses and moments of sharing.

Prevenzione di precisione per il tumore prostatico

- 4** The project proposed by the **Edo and Elvo Tempia Foundation** assesses the impact of physical activity on prostate cancer prevention, involving a group of men over 50 in outdoor sports and promoting the importance of taking care of one's body.

The disbursement process


In order to ensure utmost transparency and compliance with specific ethical and behavioural principles, in 2018, we assessed the **design of the internal controls** over the risks to which our activities as a corporate Foundation may be exposed.

In this respect, a strong culture of **risk management** and the implementation of controls by the structure and the people working for the Foundation were essential to ensure the efficient and effective use of the resources, compliance with applicable rules and regulations and the accuracy of the information disclosed.


The controls carried out as part of the disbursement process applicable to projects covered:

- the Patron Committee's analysis and approval of the selected intervention areas, of the projects to support, and of the partners with whom to collaborate;
- the Arbitration Committee's checking that the selected areas and projects comply with the Code of Ethics, the guidelines, as well as reporting any inconsistencies/irregularities to the Operating Committee in order to correct or adjust the decisions made or provide useful information to support the selected proposals;
- the traceability of the data included in potential beneficiaries' contribution applications and in the supporting documentation submitted in order to objectively check the eligibility, project effectiveness, strategic and values compliance and the sustainability of the project, both in the short term and should the Foundation's support cease;
- the preparation of specific reports that detail all the projects for which a contribution application has been submitted or a project worthy of support;
- the Patron Committee's analysis and approval of projects included in the implementation plan, previously identified by the Operating Committee based on the information included in the above-mentioned reports;
- the monitoring and assessment of projects by analysing the information included in the projects' progress reports, which are filled out by the beneficiary organisations, and the supporting documentation obtained;
- periodic reporting to the Patron Committee on the projects' progress up until their completion;
- consistency between the amounts to be paid and those which are expected to be distributed according to the relevant authorisation.




2022 Implementation plan




